Cameras: Webcams

iSight Webcams

These are included with every Mac product so no need for external camera.

Logitech Webcams http://logitech.com/

Whatever camera you get should have HD as this is the technology going forward. **C525** (HD720p) and **C920** (HD1080p) have been recommended to me.

Amazon also has great comparison charts. Search for one of above webcams to see one.

Cameras: Pocket Camcorders

Kodak PlayTouch

Waterproof. Has a mic jack, which is a great feature. I have it and like it enough.

Kodak Zi8

Playtouch replaced, so no longer being made, but available and very expensive. I have this camera and like it better than the PlayTouch. External mic jack.

Flip

Still available, though no longer being made. Prices are way up. Great video quality (better than Kodak), great sound, NO external mic jack. I have the Ultra HD model.

iPhone

Good enough video capability. Can be enhanced with apps. New iPhone 4S has better camera than older ones. I use 4G on the go and the headphones also have a mic, which works beautifully. No zoom feature on iPhone 4 or older. But inexpensive apps will solve.

Cameras: Mid-Range & DSLR

Canon T3i

Widely used and reviewed as excellent HD video capabilities. Mic input jack. About \$700 including lens. Rotating viewfinder (for easy framing)

Canon Vixia HF R300

Nice camcorder with rotating viewfinder (for easy framing) & mic input jack. About \$300. You will also have to buy an SD memory card. Not expensive.



Panasonic HDC-SD90

Camcorder only. Small, excellent video quality, external mic jack, rotating viewfinder (for easy framing. About \$550

Lights

Cowboy Studio http://cowboystudio.com

Variety of video lighting and backdrops at great prices. I have the 2000-watt 2-light kit. Does a very nice job. About \$175. A bit difficult to assemble, but great results and great customer service. You can also get these through Amazon.

Home Depot, Lowes, or other Big Box Home Improvement or Hardware Stores

Halogen work lights – I have the telescoping, double lamp. They are very bright, have different settings, but get extremely hot. Less than \$100

Microphones & Headsets (USB for Computer VoIP)

Logitech ClearChat Comfort USB

This is the headset have been using. Pros: comfortable, good quality sound, inexpensive. Cons: bulky \$35

Audio Technica AT2020USB

Desktop mic with great sound. I use and love it. Make sure you get the USB version, not the XLR.

Shure PG-42 USB

From one of the top names in audio. Excellent reviews. \$250 mic only.

I purchased a Snowball, which came highly recommended from a trusted source but returned it because I wasn't happy with the quality of the sound. However, many people love it.

Microphones & Headsets (XLR Lapel/Lavalier for Camcorders, Etc.)

AudioTechnica

ATR 3350 Wired Lapel Mic (find at Amazon)

I use this one with my Kodak Zi8. Works well enough. 20 ft. wire. About \$20

ATR 288W Wireless Lavaliere/Lapel Mic (find at Amazon)

I have this and it works very well for the price! Comes with a handheld, too. About \$120.

I have this one, too, and works fine. Wouldn't be surprised if it's manufactured by AudioTechnica. About \$25

iMovie

Apple software that comes bundled on every Mac. Appls available for iPhone, iPad. Basic and very easy to learn and use.

Software for editing and screencasting for PC and Mac. I find it a bit complicated to use, but many, many people use and love it, especially for screencasting. \$100. Free trial available.

ProPrompter App for iPhone, iPad

I love this so much and use it for videos that are longer. Big time-saver. \$10

Teleprompt+ App for iPhone, iPad

I just downloaded this for my Mac. You can see your image AND the scrolling. You can also adjust scrolling easily. Big time-saver. \$15
